WHOLE SCHOOL INFORMATION



FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND THE KNAVESMIRE OFFER

If your family qualifies for free school meals (aside from the universal free school meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) you will also qualify for The Knavesmire offer. This means, in addition to free school meals, families can be provided with:



- a school jumper <u>or</u> a school cardigan
- a school footwear voucher
- School milk
- one term free swimming travel costs
- two half-terms of free extra-curricular club participation
- free school trips
- negotiated costs for residential visits

Please come to the school office for a form so we can order your child's jumper/cardigan, shoe voucher and milk.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

Free School Meals are automatically applied to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This entitlement can be extended to children where families are in receipt of certain benefits and earnings do not exceed a threshold. These benefits include:

Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit)

What a lovely week we've had, the children have enjoyed the launch of our Space Big Idea! We've made some astronaut masks and 2d shape rockets already!

In maths we've been looking at size ordering, in phonics we've focussed on the letter 'r' and we've enjoyed making some cheeky fairies 'figure of 8' shapes in handwriting!

RECEPTION MESSAGES

Happy Friday! We have started our new Big Idea all about the story of Handa's Surprise! In our Literacy lesson, we tasted the fruit that Handa has in her basket. We then wrote words to describe how the fruit tasted, its texture and whether we liked or disliked the fruit. In our Big Idea lessons, we used chalks to draw the different fruits from the story. We used different pressures to create lighter and darker shades. In our second lesson, we practised colour mixing using paints. We experimented to create lighter and darker shades and learnt about how we can make new colours. In Phonics, we have been reviewing our new sounds such as /oa/ /ar/ /ur/ and /ear/. We have been practising to read longer words that include these sounds. During maths, we have been learning about the numbers 6, 7 and 8. We have recognised different representations of the numbers, found one more and one less of each number and explored the different compositions of the numbers using part- whole models. In PE, we started football! During our first lesson, we explored how we can have control over the ball. We tried to keep the ball close to us while we were dribbling and changing directions. Once we had gained control, we dribbled the ball between cones. Have a lovely weekend

YEAR 1 MESSAGES

Year One have been busy this week starting their new Big idea about vehicles and travel. We have thought about and described what a vehicle is and used our art knowledge to paint our favourite vehicle. In English, we have looked at sentences using 'and' to join ideas and in Maths we have been subtracting one digit numbers using the number line. We have organised a trip to The National Railway Museum on the morning of Wednesday 13th March. This will enrich our Big Idea and enable the children to see some vehicles from the past. YEAR 2 MESSAGES

Year 2 have had a great first week back after half term. We have jumped straight into our new Big Idea which is all about 'The History of Chocolate in York' - this week we have looked at when the first chocolate was made in York and learnt lots about Joseph Terry and Joseph Rowntree including the impact that Joseph Rowntree had on York. In English we are starting to write character descriptions, first we have been describing the appearance and personality of the characters in 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory' which is also our class novel. In maths it has been all about money this week! We have been doing lots of practical lessons using different coins to pay for things. Just a quick reminder that we will be having Forest School on a Thursday morning in weeks 1 - 4 so please bring weather appropriate clothing for this (coats, wellies etc). Lastly, keep an eye out on Parent Pay for the reminder about a voluntary contribution for our 'Journey of a workshop which will Cocoa Bean' be taking place next week. The Year 2 Team

YEAR 3 MESSAGES

The children have arrived back into school with a great deal of positive energy and have been working really hard. In maths, we have focused our attention on fractions. We have looked at what a fraction actually is, how to compare them and how to find equivalent fractions. During our English lessons, we have identified features of biographies ready to write an independent piece of writing based on a famous historical figure (Marie Curie). In our Big Idea sessions, we have sketched a London skyline and then designed and made skyline silhouettes. Maths homework is ONLINE this week. There will be a sheet stuck in your child's homework book with all the details of how to access MyMaths. Spelling homework will be the prefixes 'super' and 'auto'. Have a great weekend,

YEAR 4 MESSAGES

Well done to Year 4 who have started the half term with excitement and enthusiasm for the play. We are really impressed with the way that the children have taken to their roles and can tell that many have been practising at home. We thank all adults at home for helping them to begin learning their lines. Inspired by Mary Poppins, we have looked during Science at the roles of air pressure, drag and gravity in flying, conducting a scientific investigation involving parachutes made from different materials. The children have created hypotheses, conducted a fair test and then evaluated their results. We have concluded our topic on fractions during Maths and the children have continued to impress with their efforts towards achieving their personal best Soundcheck scores. Our new English topic is persuasive writing, where we have studied persuasive leaflets and their features. We will begin to use this knowledge to write our own persuasive leaflets
