# WHOLE SCHOOL INFORMATION



## FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND THE KNAVESMIRE OFFER

If your family qualifies for free school meals (aside from the universal free school meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) you will also qualify for The Knavesmire offer. This means, in addition to free school meals, families can be provided with:



- a school jumper **or** a school cardigan
- **a school footwear voucher**
- School milk
- **one term free swimming travel costs**
- two half-terms of free extra-curricular club participation
- **free school trips**
- negotiated costs for residential visits

Please come to the school office for a form so we can order your child's jumper/cardigan, shoe voucher and milk.

## FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

Free School Meals are automatically applied to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This entitlement can be extended to children where families are in receipt of certain benefits and earnings do not exceed a threshold. These benefits include:

**Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit)**



## RECEPTION MESSAGES

Happy Friday!

This week in Phonics we have been learning how to read longer words with double letters, such as 'rabbit' and 'ladder'. In Literacy, we have been learning about instructions. The children practised writing instructions to make a fruit salad, using 'bossy words' at the start. In maths, we have looked at odd and even and doubles up to eight. In PE, we have continued our skills of dribbling and practised carefully passing the ball to our partner using the inside of our foot. During Forest School, we had a go at planting the seeds we found when we tried lots of different fruits last week. We are excited to see what happens to them! In Big Idea, we used paint to create large fruit bowls, like the ones from Handa's Surprise. These will look great with fruit the children created using chalk and paint. On Friday, we introduced what maps are. We explored the different kinds of maps and how they are used. These skills will be needed next week when we use maps to identify where our fruit comes from around the world.

## YEAR 1 MESSAGES

This week, Year One have been identifying and labelling different types of vehicles and finding out what early vehicles were like. In English, we practised writing compound sentences making sure we joined two clauses using 'and'. In Maths, we have been reading and writing numbers up to 50 and counting in multiples of 10. Our goal at the end of the current Big Idea is to make our own vehicles. To enable us to do this successfully, each child will need at least 4 matching plastic bottle tops. These can come from milk bottles, drinks bottles etc and can either be kept at home or brought into school and stored for the last week of term when we will make our models. **We also need more volunteers for our trip to The National Railway Museum on Wednesday 13th March. If you are able to help between 9:30am and 12:00pm, please speak to either the Year One team or the office staff.**

## YEAR 2 MESSAGES

What a brilliant week we have had! On Tuesday, we were lucky to have York Cocoa House lead a workshop with us in school, teaching us all about the journey of a cocoa bean. In maths, we have completed some reasoning and problem solving quizzes and the children have worked extremely hard. Year 5 have had a wheelie great week this week! Many of the children took part in their cycle training, on either Tuesday or Wednesday, completing Levels 1 and 2. A small group of children from Year 5 and 6 attended a dance festival at York High School and enjoyed performing a 'dance-themed' routine to a mash-up of three songs. In Writing, the children have innovated an introduction to the story 'The Anglo-Saxon Boy' which is in preparation before writing their own next week. 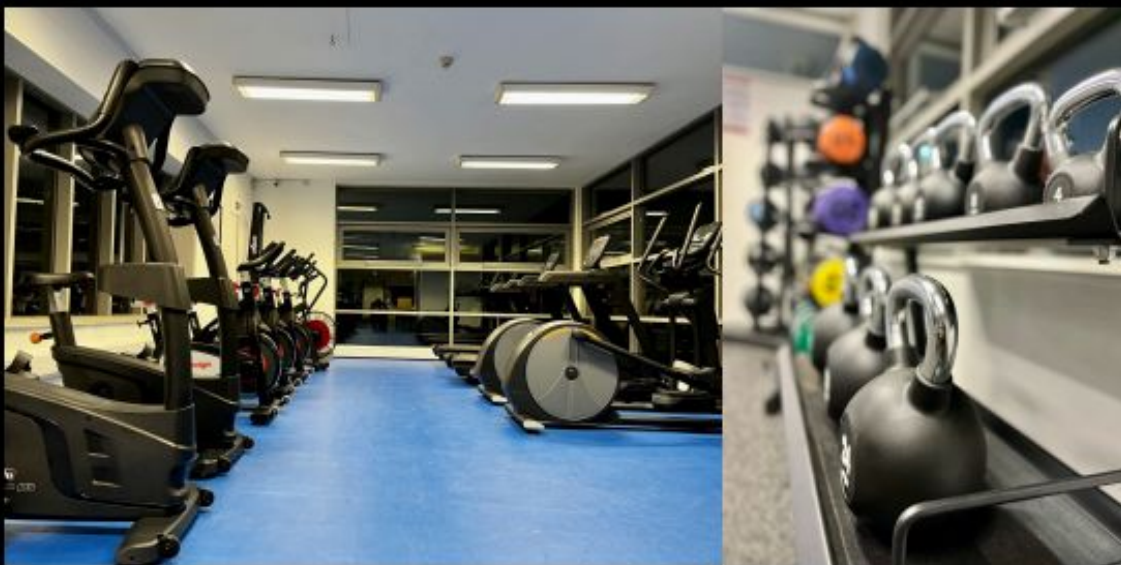
