## **Principles of SPG**

#### **Sports Premium**

Sports Premium Funding designed to raise the profile of sports and healthy lifestyles for pupils, creating a legacy in schools. Ofsted assess and report on how effectively this funding is being used to improve PE and sport provision making a judgement on the quality of Leadership and Management. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport, so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels of which they are capable.

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport its offers.

This means that we should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

There are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:

- the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school
- the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- increased participation in competitive sport

#### **Our Principles**

- Increase pupil engagement in sport
- Target vulnerable pupil groups and increase participation in developing active lives
- Identify and develop sporting talent
- Promote healthy life-styles
- Engage in partnership with community sports clubs
- Develop academic success through identifiable correlation between pupil participation in sports and engagement with academic ambition

#### Focus of SGP spending 2019/20

#### **Provision**

This year Knavesmire Primary School will receive a Sports Premium Grant of £19,550 (£16,000 lump sum plus £10 per pupil) and will use the fund in further raising the standard of our sports provision. This will include:

- Additional 'excellent' sports practitioners
- PE top-up equipment
- Targeted PE resources
- Sports Kits for KS1 & KS2 teams
- York School Sports Partnership competition package
- Teacher CPD
- Extra sports clubs for pupils

- Enrichment
- Lunchtime/playtime active resources

The table below broadly outlines the areas of funding as a percentage of the total PPF income:

Provision Area:	Spending profile:	Description:
YSSP buy in	43% (equivalent to £8527)	York School Sport Partnership facilitates intra and inter competitions up to Level 3. It also includes CPD support for staff and half-termly sports practitioners to work alongside teachers to develop performance. Additional extra-curricular club are also provided.
Fit for 30 resources	3% (equivalent to £650)	The 'Fit for 30' agenda will be supported by additional resource. This will be supplemented by 'Friends of Knavesmire' and will support both lunchtime and playtime provision.
Sport kits	17% (equivalent to £350)	Sports team are well resourced with excellent kits to encourage pride and ambition. A small budget will help to maintain quality of sports kits.
PE resource budget	16% (equivalent to £3052)	Increased PE resource budget will support increasing size of school, school increasingly significant role in cluster partnerships, and maintain resource to support excellent PE provision and delivery.
Leadership support	5% (equivalent to £900)	Leadership support budget will enable PE leaders to develop their own and teacher CPD. Impact will be evaluated and the opportunity of funded leadership time will create sustainability of improved provision.

Staffing for competitions	5% (equivalent to £900)	An increasing number of sports competitions take place in the school day. A limited budget for this will release/support staff to attend.
Sports club grant	8% (equivalent to £1500)	We cannot provide any other clubs run by external providers due to facilities being used at all times. However, many staff run sports clubs in slots of times with creative use of space. This grant will support staff in purchasing of kit as a reward/instinctive.
Whole staff MWB through sports training	5% (equivalent to £1000)	Training for support to support MWB through sport.
Specialist Sports Delivery	7% (equivalent to £1520)	The school and parent contributions will support Specialist Sports Delivery sessions in schools for all pupils.
Inspirational Sports Trips	3% (equivalent to £500)	The school and parent contributions will support opportunities for pupils to attend elite sports events. In the past, this has inspired pupils to participate.
Fuel	3% (equivalent to £500)	A small fuel allowance will support transport to events in the minibus.

## Reporting

It will be the responsibility of the Head, or a delegated member of staff, to produce regular reports for the Governing Body of:

• the progress made towards impact on target areas

- an outline of the provision that was made since the last meeting.
- an evaluation of the cost effectiveness, in terms of the progress made by the pupils receiving a particular provision, when compared with other forms of support.

The Governors of the school will ensure that there is an annual statement on how the Sports Premium funding has been used to address the issue inactive pupils and the promotion of healthy lifestyles. This task will be carried out and will appear on our school website (DFE funding impact document).
