## **Principles of SPG**

#### **Sports Premium**

Sports Premium Funding is designed to raise the profile of sports and healthy lifestyles for pupils, creating a legacy in schools. Ofsted assess and report on how effectively this funding is being used to improve PE and sport provision, making a judgement on the quality of Leadership and Management. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport, so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels of which they are capable.

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and the sport provision that it offers.

This means that we should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that school already offers;
- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

There are 5 key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:

- the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school:
- the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement;
- increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport;
- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils;
- increased participation in competitive sport.

#### **Our Principles:**

- Increase pupil engagement in sport;
- Target vulnerable pupil groups and increase participation in developing active lives;
- Identify and develop sporting talent;
- Promote healthy life-styles;
- Engage in partnership with community sports clubs;
- Develop academic success through identifiable correlation between pupil participation in sports and engagement with academic ambition.

### Focus of SGP spending 2020/21

#### **Provision**

This year Knavesmire Primary School will receive a Sports Premium Grant of £19,540 (£16,000 lump sum plus £10 per pupil) and will use the fund in further raising the standard of our sports provision. This will include:

- Additional 'excellent' sports practitioners;
- PE resources;
- Targeted PE resources;
- Sports Kits for KS1 & KS2 teams;
- York School Sports Partnership competition package;
- Teacher CPD;
- Extra sports clubs for pupils;

- Enrichment;
- Lunchtime/playtime, keep active resources.

The table below broadly outlines the areas of funding as a percentage of the total PPF income:

Provision Area:	Spending profile:	Description:
YSSP buy in	£7000	York School Sport Partnership facilitates inter competitions up to Level 3. It also includes CPD support for staff and half-termly sports practitioners to work alongside teachers to develop their teaching ability within P.E. Additional extracurricular club are also provided.
Fit for 30 resources	£500	The 'Fit for 30' school initiative will be supported by additional funds for resources being made available. This will be supplemented by 'Friends of Knavesmire' when possible and will enable a higher level of active provision for lunchtimes and playtimes.
Swimming support fund	£1000	Year 3 children undertake a weekly swimming lesson throughout that year. The swimming support fund will enable any child who joins the school subsequently to access private swimming lessons. This way, as many children as possible will be able to meet the required level of swimming proficiency and water safety by the time they leave year 6.
P.E resource budget	£5000	The P.E. resource budget will support the increasing need for more equipment in light of the COVID pandemic and resulting 'bubbles' around

P.E. Leadership and staff support time	£2000	P.E. Leadership support time will enable P.E. leaders to develop their own and other teacher's CPD. 'Virtual' competition programmes will require pupil performance data to be added online. Release time will be available for this, as well as to maintain and update displays
		promoting healthy lifestyle choices and celebration displays of competitions within 'bubbles'.
Weekly sports specialist time	£2280	Additional sports specialists will be employed to provide CPD for teaching staff and additional sporting opportunities for children throughout the school.
Inspirational Sports Talks/Workshops/Mental well-being through Sport and activity. TBC	£1260	The school and parent contributions will support opportunities for pupils to attend elite sports events. In the past, this has inspired pupils to participate.
Fuel	£500	A small fuel allowance will support transport to and from sporting events in the minibus or staff vehicles.

## Reporting

It will be the responsibility of the Head, or a delegated member of staff, to produce regular reports for the Governing Body of:

- the progress made towards impact on target areas;
- an outline of the provision that was made since the last meeting;

 an evaluation of the cost effectiveness, in terms of the progress made by the pupils receiving a particular provision, when compared with other forms of support.

The Governors of the school will ensure that there is an annual statement on how the Sports Premium funding has been used to address the issue inactive pupils and the promotion of healthy lifestyles. This task will be carried out and will appear on our school website (DFE funding impact document).
