WHOLE SCHOOL INFORMATION



FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND THE KNAVESMIRE OFFER

If your family qualifies for free school meals (aside from the universal free school meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) you will also qualify for The Knavesmire offer. This means, in addition to free school meals, families can be provided with:



- a school jumper **or** a school cardigan
- **a school footwear voucher**
- School milk
- **one term free swimming travel costs**
- two half-terms of free extra-curricular club participation
- **free school trips**
- negotiated costs for residential visits

Please come to the school office for a form so we can order your child's jumper/cardigan, shoe voucher and milk.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

Free School Meals are automatically applied to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This entitlement can be extended to children where families are in receipt of certain benefits and earnings do not exceed a threshold. These benefits include:

Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit)

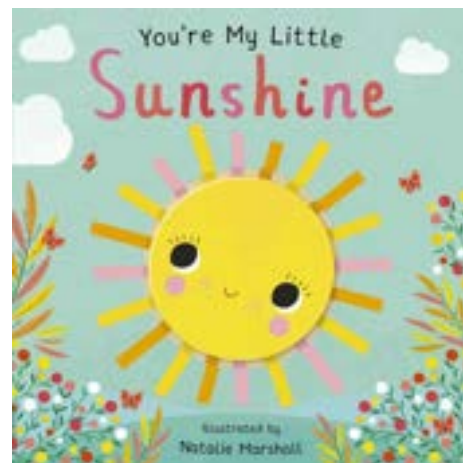

This week in English, we have created text maps for one of the poems we have worked with and then we changed some of the lines to help us create our own poem. YEAR 2 MESSAGES

This week, Year 2 have been working incredibly hard! In Maths, we have been revising our knowledge of fractions of shapes and amounts. Next week, we will be recapping our key mathematical methods. In English, the children have been innovating instructions whilst also practising how to sequence steps in chronological order. Next week, the children will be writing their instructions for their own Lego sets which they have been excitingly designing this week. The children have been amazing throughout this Big Idea so far and we are blown away by their enthusiasm! Next week, the children will be preparing for our end goal: To make our own Lego Movie! The children will build settings and film their own stories. Thank you as ever for your continued support with the children's learning. Have a lovely weekend and enjoy the sunshine!

YEAR 3 MESSAGES

What a busy yet fun week we have had in Year 3! This week, we have continued with our paper mache fun and have completed painting our caterpillar for the Rowntree Park Scarecrow Festival. We have also made a model of a human hand using string, foam, straws and beads. In Maths, we have looked at adding and subtracting fractions and finding the whole. Next week we will be moving on to looking at fractions of an amount. During our English lessons, the children have furthered their research on the human body and in particular the skeletal and muscular systems. This will form the basis of the children's Non-Chronological report on The Human Body which they will start to write next week. Maths homework is ONLINE and linked to adding and subtracting fractions. Spelling homework (CEW recap) will be stuck in homework books. If your child doesn't have their homework book in school or it is full, you should find the sheets in their school bag! We have loaned out several towels and other swimming paraphernalia during the last few weeks. Thank you to those who have washed and returned some of these items. However, we are still missing several towels so if you find a damp one in the bottom of a bag somewhere and don't recognise it then it's probably one of ours! We'd be grateful if these can be cleaned and sent back in next week prior to our swimming session. Have a brilliant weekend.

YEAR 4 MESSAGES

Year 4's week has started with a change of Big Idea Topic, to Festivals. The children have answered the guiding question, 'How can we stage a festival?'. This week, they began the topic by answering the questions, 'What is a festival and why do we have them?' and 'How many types of festival are around the world and what are they?'. We have been exploring what makes a festival and looking at various festivals around the world, including some unusual ones. We will also be finding out 'How do we hear sound?' within Science.

In Writing, we have moved onto poetry, starting by assembling lines from Pie Corbett's 'Owl' into the order we thought they belonged in. We identified a variety of figurative language found in poetry, such as metaphors, personification, hyperbole, repetition and similes. The children also gave their opinions on the poem, pointing out lines and phrases they enjoyed, and describing how the poem made them feel.

Maths has had a continued focus on time, with the children reading an analogue clock, converting time and calculating the difference between two different times. We then moved on to conversion between the 24 hour clock and the 12 hour clock.

Year 5 have had a super week! We can't believe it's the end of Week 5 - this half-term is flying by! Year 5 have been busy discussing the importance of heroes and role models, in Big Idea lessons, as well as planning what they'll be packing in their rucksacks and suitcases for Carlton Lodge. In Writing, the children have planned their narratives, with the purpose of entertaining their audience, with 'choose your own' options. In Maths, the children have been working hard to add and subtract decimals using the column method. During class assemblies, children have been discussing body image and their opinions on whether it matters what you look like or not. They have really impressed us with their well-articulated perspectives. In PE, the children have begun their tennis unit and are delighted to be enjoying developing their skills in the nice weather outside!
