Geography Key Information:

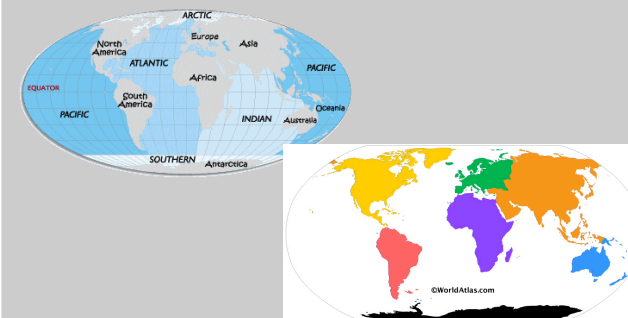
- There are 5 oceans in the World and they are called: The Pacific, Atlantic, Indian, Southern, Arctic.

Science Key Information:

- Animals obtain their food from plants and other animals. You can show this using a food chain.
- Things in the ocean can be sorted into: living, dead or never been alive.
- Habitats provide the vital things that animals need to survive e.g. food, shelter and somewhere to raise their young.

Knowledge Vocabulary:

Equator- An invisible line around the middle of the Earth.

Continent- A large area of land on Earth made up of different countries.

Ocean- Large bodies of water made up of different seas.

Habitat- An environment where an animal lives.

Coast- Parts of land that are next to the sea.

Conservation- To protect an area or object.
