#### WHOLE SCHOOL INFORMATION



#### FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND THE KNAVESMIRE OFFER

If your family qualifies for free school meals (aside from the universal free school meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) you will also qualify for The Knavesmire offer. This means, in addition to free school meals, families can be provided with:



- a school jumper <u>or</u> a school cardigan
- a school footwear voucher
- School milk
- one term free swimming travel costs
- two half-terms of free extra-curricular club participation
- free school trips
- negotiated costs for residential visits

Please come to the school office for a form so we can order your child's jumper/cardigan, shoe voucher and milk.

#### FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

Free School Meals are automatically applied to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This entitlement can be extended to children where families are in receipt of certain benefits and earnings do not exceed a threshold. These benefits include:

Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit)

Thank you to everyone who has visited and supported the School Library this year!





# Little Sips BIG ADVENTURES

Dear parent/guardian,

We would like to inform you of an important update regarding the school milk scheme, administered by Cool Milk. Mid-morning milk provides a much-needed nutritional boost and keeps children hydrated between breakfast and lunch. Children receive free milk until the age of 5. After that, they can continue to reap the benefits of mid-morning milk at a subsidised\* cost.

Due to challenging weather conditions this spring and summer resulting in reduced milk volumes and anticipated increases in winter feed costs, the price of milk for children over 5 will soon increase. This adjustment will help Cool Milk continue to support our valued dairy partners.

However, there is good news! If your child is already 5 or will be turning 5 soon, you can still lock in the current price. Simply register your child at <a href="https://www.coolmik.com/register">www.coolmik.com/register</a> and make a payment. You even have the option to pre-pay at the existing rate for the entire academic year.

For children who are already over 5, you can make payment immediately. If your child is still under 5, we will email you shortly before their 5th birthday with easy steps to continue their milk deliveries. Rest assured, we will continue providing free milk automatically until they turn 5.

If you already have a Cool Milk account, simply log in to your existing account and make the payment for the upcoming year. To register a sibling, select 'Add Child' and fill in their details—it's that simple!

families.




#### Samba

We were very proud of our KS2 Samba band who joined with drummers from Scarcroft

school to lead the schools section of the Pride parade.

#### Assemblies / Concerts

Pupils having instrumental lessons in and out of school, have been building their confidence through playing in assemblies and a series of concerts



Year 5 finished a busy term of performances with a starring role in the SBMAT Arts Fest. The pupils took

part in a day of workshops and rehearsals followed by an evening performance for an audience of over 600. The pupils sang, danced and played the steel pan drums!



#### Choir

The choir started the year with a bang, attending the Young Voices concert at Sheffield Arena on the first day of term. They then performed their own concert in school at the end of Spring Term.





#### **Instrument Amnesty**

Do you have a violin or a flute gathering dust in your loft and making you feel guilty for never playing it?! SBMAT schools are having an instrument amnesty so please give us those musical instruments that yo no longer use and we will use them to provide our pupils with an instrument to increase access for all to learning in Music.

#### Reception

Reception have continued to explore the interrelated dimensions of music through movement and singing. We have also tried the boomwhackers and tuned percussion.

#### Year 1

In Year 1 we have listened to the Carnival of the Animals as we drew the animal we imagined the music was describing. We have continued to play the boomwhackers and in the summer term we tried the ukuleles and tuned percussion.

## Year 3

In Year 3 we have spent more time learning the recorders and we have been using balls to develop our rhythmic awareness. We have also used the ukuleles in Summer 2 to prepare for Year 4.

#### Year 5

Year 5 have had an extremely busy two terms in Music and have worked really hard to to develop their playing on the steel pan drums. We have also worked on singing in parts and will continue to develop our understanding of harmony in Year 6.

#### Year 2

Year 2 have continued to learn the ocarina and have begun to read notation when playing. Through movement and singing they have continued to develop their awareness of pitch and rhythm.

#### Year 4

Following their participation in Mary
Poppins, the Year 4s have entered for
their Arts Award Discover. We have
completed the log books and the
certificates will be sent home after the
holidays. We have also continued to
play the ukuleles and have tried the
steel pans.

#### Year 6

Year 6 have continued to develop their music theory understanding. In preparation for the Year 6 show they have worked on their control and tone when singing. Through games and movement they have increased their rhythmic awareness.

#### Nursery

Nursery have continued to explore the instruments including untuned percussion and boomwhackers. We have continued to sing and have even rapped the Grandma Rap!





# Humber and North Yorkshire Asthma Friendly Schools Newsletter

Asthma is the most common long-term medical condition affecting children and young people in the UK. Around 3 children in every school classroom have asthma. Although there is no cure for asthma, for most people with asthma it can be well managed by taking a <u>preventer inhaler</u> every day, even when feeling well.





A reliever inhaler should be easily accessible to someone with asthma, in case of worsening asthma symptoms, such as wheezing, breathlessness or cough. However, good asthma control means having NO symptoms.

It is important to have good inhaler technique to ensure the medicine in the inhaler reaches the lungs, where it is needed. Inhaler technique is different depending on the type of inhaler that has been prescribed. Over the summer holidays continue to take the preventer inhaler as directed, to prevent troublesome asthma symptoms and dangerous asthma attacks. The benefits of the preventer inhaler build up over time. It protects the airways from getting inflamed and means they are less likely to react to asthma triggers, such as pollen, air pollution and viruses. #### #AskAboutAsthma 2024: helping children and young people to live their best lives

#AskAboutAsthma 2024 takes place from 9-15 September. This year's campaign is focusing on helping children and young people with asthma to live their best lives.

Good asthma control means having no symptoms and can be achieved by following these four asks:

- 1. get an asthma action plan in place.
- 2. understand how to use inhalers correctly.
- schedule an asthma review every year and after every attack,
- 4. consider air pollution and its impact on lung health.
