WHOLE SCHOOL INFORMATION



FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND THE KNAVESMIRE OFFER

If your family qualifies for free school meals (aside from the universal free school meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) you will also qualify for The Knavesmire offer. This means, in addition to free school meals, families can be provided with:



- a school jumper <u>or</u> a school cardigan
- a school footwear voucher
- School milk
- one term free swimming travel costs
- two half-terms of free extra-curricular club participation
- free school trips
- negotiated costs for residential visits

Please come to the school office for a form so we can order your child's jumper/cardigan, shoe voucher and milk.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

Free School Meals are automatically applied to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This entitlement can be extended to children where families are in receipt of certain benefits and earnings do not exceed a threshold. These benefits include:

Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit)

YEAR 1 MESSAGES

We have had another busy and brilliant week in Year One. We have continued to work hard with our book study which is based on the story 'The Disgusting Sandwich' by Gareth Edwards. This week, we have practised writing instructions. The children have written instructions to explain how they made their sandwiches last week. We have also been learning all about badgers! We have been mixing powder paint to match the colours of badgers.

Next week, we will use these skills to paint our own pictures of badgers. In maths, we have been learning how to read numbers as words. Next week, we will be finding 'one more' of different numbers. If children are bringing in a treat to hand out for their birthday, please can we ask that they are in a small packet. This makes it easier to hand out to the children and also allows adults to decide when the child can have their treat. This would be highly appreciated, thank you.

YEAR 2 MESSAGES

Our current Book Study 'The Snail and the Whale' has kept us busy again in Year 2 this week! We have been inspired by Julia Donaldson's rhyming in our English lessons and have started to explore Poetry. The children are using their clay animals from the first week to help inspire their writing! We are also continuing to focus on baseline, cursive handwriting to help keep our writing clear. In Maths, we have been working hard on their 10 x tables and next week we will be moving onto the 2 x tables as a focus. During our Big Idea lessons, the children have explored atlases, maps and questioned which animals would live in the different oceans and continents around the world. We have even discovered our Field Work skills with creating maps of our school playground before channelling our inner adventurous snails and plotting our route around the school!

Our fluency homework books have now been sent home with the children. The children's spellings to focus on for that week are in this book - we will quiz the children on these spellings on a Friday in school so please can we ask that the book comes back into school on this day. We will then send home new fluency homework. As always, we encourage the children to do their best with these quizzes and we will work on any spelling struggles in school to help build their skills and confidence.

Thank you to those of you who could attend our year group welcome meeting after school on Tuesday - the information we shared is on the website page. Please do not hesitate to come and speak to a member of the team if you have any questions about what was shared!

YEAR 3 MESSAGES

Year 3 have had a super week! In Writing, the children have been busy innovating the model text by changing vocabulary within the letter as well as the sender and recipient. After that, the children finished planning their own informal, persuasive letters in preparation for drafting next week. We can't wait to see their ideas come together! In Maths, the children have continued with their unit on place value by identifying the value of digits within numbers through the use of part-whole models. In Big Idea lessons, the children learned the parts of a flowering plant, the purpose of each part and the life cycle of a flowering plant. In addition, they've begun to create place cards for their tea party guests on Chromebooks, demonstrating their digital literacy skills. In PE, they've continued with developing their hockey skills skill-set to apply in a game environment at the end of the unit. Many thanks to all of the parents/ carers who attended our Parents Welcome Meeting on Monday - it was so lovely to see so many of you! We'd like to thank the volunteers who expressed an interest in coming into school to offer help where necessary. With that in mind, if any other parents/carers are also interested in coming into school to support the children within Year 3 we'd be absolutely delighted and would be very grateful if you could please let a member of the Year 3 Team know. During the meeting, it was mentioned that the powerpoint presentation would be made available for future reference. Please find the Year 3 Parents/Carers Welcome Meeting powerpoint presentation on our school website.




