



Knowledge Vocabulary:

- 1. **Ocean**: A large area of water that covers the earth's surface made of smaller seas.
- 2. **Habitat**: An environment that an animal lives in.
- 3. **Adaptation**: A change to an animal's body or way of life so that they can survive.
- 4. **Sculpture**: shaping a material to make a 3D model.
- 5. **Kindness**: the act of being friendly, generous and considerate to others.
- 6. **Field-work**: collecting data in an environment.

Science Knowledge

- Identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants.
- Identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats, including microhabitats.

Geography Knowledge

- Name and locate the world's continents and oceans.
