FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND THE KNAVESMIRE OFFER

If your family qualifies for free school meals (aside from the universal free school meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) you will also qualify for The Knavesmire offer. This means, in addition to free school meals, families can be provided with:



- a school jumper <u>or</u> a school cardigan
- a school footwear voucher
- School milk
- one term free swimming travel costs
- two half-terms of free extra-curricular club participation
- free school trips
- negotiated costs for residential visits

Please come to the school office for a form so we can order your child's jumper/cardigan, shoe voucher and milk.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

Free School Meals are automatically applied to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This entitlement can be extended to children where families are in receipt of certain benefits and earnings do not exceed a threshold. These benefits include:

Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit)

YEAR 1 MESSAGES

This week, we have had a wonderful time in our Big Idea lessons learning more about how animals move and how their structure helps them. We have looked at the way birds move and the children carefully observed bird feathers using magnifying glasses.

In English, we composed simple sentences to describe how birds move and how they use their wings. In maths, we have been learning how to find 'one less' of numbers. Next week, we are going to be learning about animal classifications on our trip to Askham Bryan (please remember children need a pack up and a warm coat)!

YEAR 2 MESSAGES

Year 2 have had another great week! This week, we have been working hard to use our fingers and arrays to solve multiplication questions in maths. Next week, we will be moving on to division facts and people method. In Big Idea, the children have been learning about the Gunpowder Plot, why it happened and why we celebrate Bonfire Night. We even had our own debate as if we were in Parliament ourselves! The children have also enjoyed a Black History Boogie as well as activities for World Mental Health Day.

YEAR 3 MESSAGES

Year 3 have had a wonderful week! In Big Idea, the children have designed their savoury and sweet treats, to be served at their Mad Hatter's Tea Party on Tuesday 15th October, and decorated bunting which will be displayed at the tea party. In Writing, the children have learned how to use a dictionary and used it to correct spelling mistakes in their drafted pieces of writing as well as publish their finished informal, persuasive letters to their chosen guests. The children's guests should receive their handwritten informal, persuasive letters over the weekend - fingers crossed! In Maths, the children have continued with adding numbers using the column method, applied their problem solving and reasoning skills and subtracted using a number line. As part of Black History Month, the children took part in a baseball game, created an abstract piece of artwork inspired by the work of Alma Thomas and enjoyed a boogie. To celebrate Jackie Robinson, who was the first black baseball player to play in the American Baseball league, the children played their own baseball game. Additionally, we looked at a range of black music artists and had a boogie to some of their songs! We hope you've enjoyed seeing what the children have been upto on X (formerly known as Twitter) and Instagram.

YEAR 4 MESSAGES

In English this week, we have presented opposing views to the question: Should Charlie steal an everlasting gobstopper from Willy Wonka? Here's a snippet from one of this week's star writers:




