FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND THE KNAVESMIRE OFFER

If your family qualifies for free school meals (aside from the universal free school meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) you will also qualify for The Knavesmire offer. This means, in addition to free school meals, families can be provided with:



- a school jumper <u>or</u> a school cardigan
- a school footwear voucher
- School milk
- one term free swimming travel costs
- two half-terms of free extra-curricular club participation
- free school trips
- negotiated costs for residential visits

Please come to the school office for a form so we can order your child's jumper/cardigan, shoe voucher and milk.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

Free School Meals are automatically applied to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This entitlement can be extended to children where families are in receipt of certain benefits and earnings do not exceed a threshold. These benefits include:

Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit)



GOVERNOR NEWSLETTER DECEMBER 2024

Continuing the series of governors contributing to the newsletter, my name is Joe Maitland and I am a co-opted governor. For those of you who might not know what that means, it's simply that I am an appointed governor (rather than elected), having first started as an elected parent governor in 2017. I live just outside of York (having previously lived about 250 metres from the school) and am a solicitor at a law firm based in Leeds. My two daughters both attended the school and are now in years 8 and 10 at Fulford Secondary School (which makes me feel very old...).

It has been (and continues to be) an absolute privilege to be a governor at the school. It has given me the chance to see close up how hard the teachers all work, how passionate they are about the school and your children and how they have such determination and focus (despite the numerous challenges they face, not least chronic under-funding from central government) to deliver the very best outcomes for all children who come through the school. Having seen all of this over the years I have been a governor, I am incredibly proud to be associated with such a fantastic school.

As we mentioned in the last update, governor visits to the school are a vital part of our role and they have continued apace (and with some more booked around enjoying the Christmas festivities!). Of those to have taken place since Jon Hodgeon's update in October:

- Vanessa Huws Jones, our Chair, (and on occasions Jackie Gray, our Vice Chair, too) continues to have fortnightly catch-up meetings with the Head and Deputy.
- In November, Jackie Gray & Jon Hodgeon attended the Trust Local Governors meeting where the Trust Chair and Chief Executive talked to Governors about the Trust's new Strategic Objectives for 2024-27, People Plan and the Promise to Vulnerable Pupils and their Families. It was a great meeting and really interesting to understand the collaborative approach being taken to implement the Strategy across the Excel family of schools, which still fully recognises the uniqueness of each school. It was also a good opportunity to meet Governors of other schools in the Trust, understand what they do to support their schools and to make connections.
- Vanessa had a general, informal visit to the school to view classes and talk to pupils and staff. Vanessa comments that it was a pleasure to be in school and she was made to feel, as always, very welcome.
- Kay Roantree visited the school in October to see how the safeguarding systems in place are working and any adaptations that have been made and to discuss national and local safeguarding issues. Kay also visited in November, in her capacity as Early Years link governor, to discuss how the Early Years team have adapted to changes in staffing, how the children have settled in Nursery and Reception and the key areas of development the team are working on.
- Also in November, Olivia Else came into school for a general walkaround and to meet with the leadership team. This visit was focused on behaviour - the school's expectations in this area and how positive and negative behaviours are handled on a daily basis. Olivia visited every year group in their classrooms and attended a whole school assembly. Olivia has fed back that it was lovely to witness such a buzzing learning environment and see children engaged in a wide range of activities.
- Jackie Gray also recently spent some time with Mr Cooper to review and learn more about some of the key data points and metrics to understand how they relate to Ofsted requirements and help inform the school's approach to pupil development across the different year groups.
- Finally, I met with Mr Cooper and Mr Gardiner in early December to discuss tests and overall performance of the school (in my role as data link Governor). It was fascinating to hear how the school uses the data available to it to track the progress of the children throughout school and spot where interventions or additional support might be needed, all designed to ensure that each child can achieve their maximum potential. I also had a walk round the school and can only echo Olivia's comments above about the buzz in each classroom. It must be a particularly difficult time of year to keep the children engaged, but our brilliant teachers more than manage to do so.

I wanted to end this section with some thank yous. First of all, thank you to all of the teaching and non-teaching staff who work so hard, day in day out, to run such an exceptional school. I hope that you all have a well-earned break over the Christmas holiday. Second, thank you to the Friends of Knavesmire who continue to provide great support for the school through various fundraising activities. During my visit, I was briefly able to see the extension of Santa's workshop the Friends had set up in school so that the children could run a secret Santa and it was filled with so much joy and excitement. Finally, thank you to all of you reading this newsletter for the many different things you do to support the school. To have the brilliant school we have requires a complex, multi-layered collaboration between lots of different people, each contributing in lots of different ways, so for whatever it is you contribute, thank you.

HOLIDAY CLUB REMINDERS
