BEHAVIOUR CURRICULUM

We're really pleased to share our Behaviour Curriculum, which has been designed in partnership with local artist Ellie Lewis. This poster helps us to show our children what we are trying to achieve, how we should behave and treat each other and what we will do to get there. It isn't exhaustive and works alongside our Behaviour Policy. We wanted it to be child friendly and we have shared it with pupils across school already. It goes hand in hand with our Knavesmire Characteristics, the 50 things and our School Aims, which together complete our school's vision.



FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND THE KNAVESMIRE OFFER

If your family qualifies for free school meals (aside from the universal free school meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) you will also qualify for The Knavesmire offer. This means, in addition to free school meals, families can be provided with:



- a school jumper <u>or</u> a school cardigan
- a school footwear voucher
- School milk
- one term free swimming travel costs
- two half-terms of free extra-curricular club participation
- free school trips
- negotiated costs for residential visits

Please come to the school office for a form so we can order your child's jumper/cardigan, shoe voucher and milk.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

Free School Meals are automatically applied to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This entitlement can be extended to children where families are in receipt of certain benefits and earnings do not exceed a threshold. These benefits include:

Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit)



In English, we have done some more work on our poem about toys. We adapted the poem and wrote our own lines, making sure that they rhymed. In maths, we have been identifying numbers using pictures and we have been writing and reading numbers to 20.

We have started netball in PE and the children have been practising their passes and footwork. We have also had a lovely Forest School session making bird feeders.

YEAR 2 MESSAGES

Year 2 have had a fantastic week immersed in our Circus themed Big Idea. We have been working on our narrative skills with sequencing events in stories as well as checking our punctuation and vocabulary choices within our writing. Through Big Idea lessons, 2G had the wonderful opportunity to be part of a circus with our Theatre Workshop that 2S had the pleasure of experiencing last week - we always love having visitors in! We also learnt different languages as we looked at different circuses that were performed around the world. The children have worked incredibly hard with their Reading skills this week as we have continued to look at comprehension questions as well as inference skills. In Maths, our shape knowledge has progressed to now looking at 3D shapes. We are continuing to practise our arithmetic skills with expanded addition and our times tables knowledge. As a reminder, we aim for the children to be fluent with multiplication and division questions in their 2, 5 and 10 times tables by the end of year 2.

This half term, we will be enjoying some outdoor PE. Please ensure that your child brings in a suitable PE kit with optional layers.

YEAR 3 MESSAGES

Year 3 have had a brilliant week! In Writing, the children have learned about dormice, collected information about them, organised the information into a spider diagram and drafted a paragraph with a learning partner. In Maths, the children have continued to consolidate their knowledge of dividing on a numberline. In Big Idea, children have learned about the many creatures that live in our Earth's oceans and have begun to make their very own aquarium. In PE, the children have continued with their gymnastics unit and worked well in pairs to create a short floor routine. There have been some slight adjustments to the Year 3 timetable. Important changes include a PE lesson only on Wednesday afternoon (no longer a PE lesson on Friday afternoon), times table/ spelling quizzes will take place on a Thursday morning (rather than on a Friday morning) and children will be given new homework on Thursday. If you have any questions or queries about anything at all, please don't hesitate to speak to a member of the Year 3 Team.

YEAR 4 MESSAGES

This week, we have continued our 'What does it take to become a game developer?' Big Idea. As well as using Canva to create video game posters, we have explored the differing sounds used in video games and investigated how sound is made. This theme has carried over to English, where we tried our hands at Pac Man, before writing a user-friendly set of instructions with our (now) expert knowledge of 'How to Boss at Pac Man'!

In Maths, we have refreshed our knowledge of column multiplication and bus stop methods, as well as solved word problems.

YEAR 5 MESSAGES

This week, we have had a big focus on deforestation and how it is impacting the Amazon Rainforest. In Big Idea, we have narrowed our focus on how human actions are affecting physical features of rainforests and created a piece of artwork to display the message 'If we do not adapt, what are the outcomes for the world and rainforests.' Both classes have produced amazing pieces of artwork which we will add colour to next week. In Writing, we have started to write a persuasive letter to either stop or carry on with deforestation depending what perspective the children chose to write from. In Maths, we have started short division and this is a topic we will continue next week. Our spelling test next week will be focused on homophones and our focus for times tables will be our 9s.

This week, we have had a fun filled in the School House!

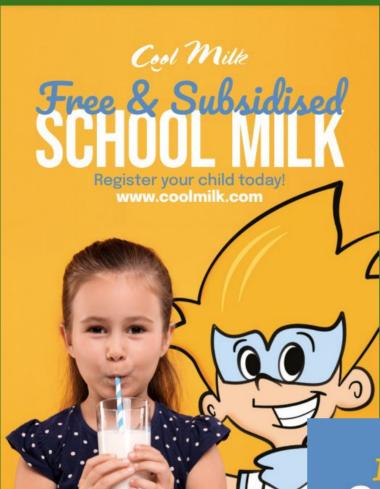
In Maths, we have learnt how to use column addition.

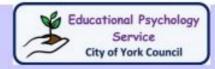




