Starting out as a night shelter, Centrepoint's work with young people has evolved beyond all recognition over the last 50 years.

In the centre of London's Soho in December 1969, the Revered Ken Leech opened a night shelter in the basement of his church to give homeless, young people a safe place to sleep. Our services are what make Centrepoint so special, we focus on giving young people not just a bed for a night but a home where they can reclaim their future with the support of our dedicated frontline workers.

Over the years we have grown, offering services around the country and developing truly innovative approaches to help young people. We work in partnership with other charities all over the UK, we learn from each other and we join forces to call for change. We know we can't end youth homelessness alone – it will take collaboration and systemic change but we believe we can do it and are committed to ending youth homelessness.

We started with one small shelter, now we support more than 2,000 young people every day through our floating support, rough sleeping and resettlement services but with almost 136,000 young people at risk of or experiencing homelessness last year – we're needed more than ever.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND THE KNAVESMIRE OFFER

If your family qualifies for free school meals (aside from the universal free school meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) you will also qualify for The Knavesmire offer. This means, in addition to free school meals, families can be provided with:



- a school jumper <u>or</u> a school cardigan
- a school footwear voucher
- School milk
- one term free swimming travel costs
- two half-terms of free extra-curricular club participation
- free school trips
- negotiated costs for residential visits

Please come to the school office for a form so we can order your child's jumper/cardigan, shoe voucher and milk.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

Free School Meals are automatically applied to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This entitlement can be extended to children where families are in receipt of certain benefits and earnings do not exceed a threshold. These benefits include:

Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit)





YEAR 2 MESSAGES

This week Year 2 have really enjoyed looking at our school book Journey. The children wrote a brilliant diary inspired by the book as well as sketching their own world inspired by Aaron Becker's illustrations. We also loved their creative and fun costumes for World Book Day and we hope the children enjoyed all the themed activities from this week!

In addition, the children have been practising using the four operations and methods to solve questions using measurements. Next week, we will be looking at fractions of shape and amounts.

Also, we want to thank you for your time with Parents' Evening meetings this week and we hope you enjoyed looking at the amazing work your children have done this year so far. This half term, we are also very lucky to welcome some university students who will be helping to support learning in the classroom.

YEAR 3 MESSAGES

Year 3 have had a great week! In Maths, they've continued their unit on Mass by learning how to add and subtract masses (grams and kilograms). In Writing, the children have delved deeper into instructions and ended the week by planning their own set of instructions that they will independently write next week. In Big Idea, the children have continued with their 3D paper-mache hot air balloon masterpieces by applying paint, copying their very own designs. In PE, the children completed the Golden Mile.

YEAR 4 MESSAGES

This week, Year 4 have been getting to know our wordless focus book, Journey by Aaron Becker. We have put ourselves into the main character's shoes, writing letters on her behalf as she journeys through an unknown land.

In the Big Idea, we have mixed oil pastels and watercolours to create bold images inspired by Journey. We have used our knowledge of both analogous colours and blending to choose colour combinations inspired by the skies shown in the book.

In Maths, this week's focus has been decimals, focusing on differentiating between tenths and hundreds and comparing numbers with decimals.

Our play practise is getting off to an energetic start and the children are impressing with the speed in which they are learning their lines. Please practise at home with them, focusing on expression and volume.

YEAR 5 MESSAGES

During our maths lessons, we have found equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages whilst tackling tricky reasoning problems.

In writing, we have created our own version of the book Journey in the form of poetry using rhyme and rhythm.

We have created our own imaginary worlds using Journey as our inspiration. Oil pastels were used to create texture rubbings using the world around us.

Year 5 had a brilliant time at Forest School this week as we made a variety of different pancakes that may or may not have already been eaten!

Next week, we will be completing maths and reading quizzes based on what we have covered so far this year. Have a great weekend,

This week, we have had a lovely week in the School House.


In Maths, we have been identifying and representing fractions.




