Starting out as a night shelter, Centrepoint's work with young people has evolved beyond all recognition over the last 50 years.

In the centre of London's Soho in December 1969, the Revered Ken Leech opened a night shelter in the basement of his church to give homeless, young people a safe place to sleep. Our services are what make Centrepoint so special, we focus on giving young people not just a bed for a night but a home where they can reclaim their future with the support of our dedicated frontline workers.

Over the years we have grown, offering services around the country and developing truly innovative approaches to help young people. We work in partnership with other charities all over the UK, we learn from each other and we join forces to call for change. We know we can't end youth homelessness alone – it will take collaboration and systemic change but we believe we can do it and are committed to ending youth homelessness.

We started with one small shelter, now we support more than 2,000 young people every day through our floating support, rough sleeping and resettlement services but with almost 136,000 young people at risk of or experiencing homelessness last year – we're needed more than ever.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND THE KNAVESMIRE OFFER

If your family qualifies for free school meals (aside from the universal free school meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) you will also qualify for The Knavesmire offer. This means, in addition to free school meals, families can be provided with:



- a school jumper <u>or</u> a school cardigan
- a school footwear voucher
- School milk
- one term free swimming travel costs
- two half-terms of free extra-curricular club participation
- free school trips
- negotiated costs for residential visits

Please come to the school office for a form so we can order your child's jumper/cardigan, shoe voucher and milk.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

Free School Meals are automatically applied to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This entitlement can be extended to children where families are in receipt of certain benefits and earnings do not exceed a threshold. These benefits include:

Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit)



RECEPTION MESSAGES

Hello Reception! We've had a wonderful week launching our new Big Idea 'Into the woods' with the story of the Gingerbread man'

The children loved listening to the story in its original form and then exploring different versions such as 'The Gingerbread Girl' and 'Biscuit Bear' they also looked for variations in the original tale when looking at different retellings!

They each made a wonderful gingerbread man suncatcher using their cutting and tearing skills with colourful tissue paper. In literacy they made a story map and in the areas of provision had a go a making masks of the different characters as well as painting and designing their own ginger people!

To top it off they made their own gingerbread men and decorated them an array of sweet treats!

In maths we've been looking at the numbers 7,8 and 9, their composition and how we can represent them as well as comparing quantities to more, fewer and equal than a given amount.

In phonics we are still working on writing and reading words containing phase 3 digraphs and the children are making great progress!

In PE they played games in the hall as the rain scuppered our netball plans!

Year One have had another wonderful week!

In our new Big Idea about celebrations, we have been learning about the Rio carnival. We learnt that it is a very special time for Christians. On Friday, we took part in a samba drum workshop which was a lot of fun! We also made our own carnival masks using different decorations. In English, we used our imagination in story writing. We imagined our own party hat, and used adjectives to describe how it looked and felt. In maths, we have been looking at the difference between numbers and we have also been looking at numbers to 50.

Next week, we will be continuing our story writing in English. We will find out where our magical hats take us when we put them on! In Big Idea, we will be learning about Ramadan and Eid. In maths, we will be counting in multiples of 10. Please can we ask that the children have everything they need to get changed for PE. This would be much appreciated, thank you.

YEAR 2 MESSAGES

This week, Year 2 have been working incredibly hard! We have used everything that we have learnt about recounts to write a detailed diary about our trip to York's Chocolate Story. Some of our children took these to the Chocolate Works to share them with the residents. In Maths, we have learnt what fractions are and how we can use them to show fractions of shape and calculate fractions of an amount. In Big Idea, we have looked at sources to describe how factories have changed over time as well as researching the life of Joseph Rowntree. Next week, we will be consolidating our knowledge so far this year by completing some Maths and Reading quizzes! If possible, we are asking that each child brings in a small rectangular tupperware box and lid (ideally the kind from takeaways!) for a tasty DT project we will be doing in two weeks time. Please make sure it is named and brought in no later than Monday 24th March.

YEAR 3 MESSAGES

Year 3 have had a wonderful week! In Writing, they've worked hard to draft and edit a set of instructions titled 'How to Make a Paper Mache Hot Air Balloon', using their own first-hand experiences to recount each step. In Maths, the children have continued their unit on Mass and Capacity. In PE, the children have begun their tennis unit.

In Big Idea, the children have continued to coat their paper-mache hot air balloons with paint, referring to their designs throughout the process, and learned how water travels through a plant's stem. In Computing, the children have continued to develop their information technology skills by creating a fact file template ahead of a Big Idea lesson where they will research an explorer and create a fact file using the information they have found.

YEAR 4 MESSAGES

Rehearsals are well underway for Year 4's Hoodwinked production and this week we have been focussing particularly on songs and dances. Please continue to encourage your child to practise their lines at home so that they can eventually feel confident to deliver them without a script.

In Maths, we have focussed on a combination of arithmetic and reasoning techniques, whilst in English our focus has been persuasive writing.


THE SCHOOL HOUSE MESSAGES






