Parents, Carers, Families,

It's been a strangely mixed week. A mix of weather (it feels really cold again), a mix of events going on in school, and a difficult incident in our community on the Knavesmire.

It was lovely to see some Y2s enjoying boccia yesterday at York High School, Circus Stu in school with classes this week, and nice to have the governors visiting on Monday.

I've sent an attendance letter out today, and we're hoping for a push to get us through to half-term. My biggest concern is the gaps pupils get in their learning as it's very difficult for teachers to revisit the different bits of missed learning. We're also sending out information to anyone with absence less than 90%. This is purely factual, but will indicate how many sessions are needed to get back on track.

Thank you for the community support in the context of yesterday's tragic incident. Occasionally it's more important to communicate with speed than it is to draft and word with care. I appreciate your understanding. Please be aware of the dangers of social media. We have been informed, in the context of yesterday, that there are disturbing videos on social media. For you and your children, don't open posts/videos without knowing the content. We can't 'unsee' things, so protecting ourselves by making wise choices is so important.

We hope that your weekend is a really pleasant one.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND THE KNAVESMIRE OFFER

If your family qualifies for free school meals (aside from the universal free school meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) you will also qualify for The Knavesmire offer. This means, in addition to free school meals, families can be provided with:



- a school jumper <u>or</u> a school cardigan
- a school footwear voucher
- School milk
- one term free swimming travel costs
- two half-terms of free extra-curricular club participation
- free school trips
- negotiated costs for residential visits

Please come to the school office for a form so we can order your child's jumper/cardigan, shoe voucher and milk.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

Free School Meals are automatically applied to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This entitlement can be extended to children where families are in receipt of certain benefits and earnings do not exceed a threshold. These benefits include:

Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit)





We have had another week filled with exciting visitors as we continue to learn about people who help us! This led to lots of discussion around the roles of medical professionals and the different jobs they can do.

During carpet sessions we listened to the 'Great Race' story which led to the development of our counting and ordering skills.

YEAR 1 MESSAGES

We kindly ask that children just bring their book bag, which is stored in their drawer in the classroom, or a very small rucksack which fits into the locker along with their coat and P.E. bag.

YEAR 2 MESSAGES

This week we have been working incredibly hard! In Maths, we have started to learn about different coins, their values and how we can add them together to make different amounts. The children have loved learning about the real life application of money, so please feel free to practise with any coins at home! In English, the children gathered information about a Circus mystery and used a range of vocabulary to write a newspaper report as a class. We will be continuing to learn about features of news reports this half term. In Big Idea, we became magicians and conducted a simple science experiment using skittles and water. We even had a special circus guest talk to us and answer our questions! Next week, we would like to invite the children to perform their own unique skills in order to take part in our guiding purpose: To join a circus! A separate letter has been sent out with more information about this. Please also look out for information about our upcoming trip to York's Chocolate Story next half term.

YEAR 3 MESSAGES

Year 3 have had a fabulous week! In Writing, they've finished their non-chronological reports about Killer Whales and have started their next unit on persuasive writing. In Maths, the children have continued with their unit on measurement. In PE, the children have enjoyed another of their weekly swimming lessons and a gymnastics lesson. In Big Idea, the children have learned about life cycles and created art work in response to the question 'What is Coral?'

YEAR 4 MESSAGES

In Year 4 this week, we have started our exciting new Big Idea, which focuses on achieving our Guiding Purpose, "To build a moving locomotive". This week, we focussed on the history of trains, looking at the first train to be invented and how trains were powered in the past. We have also used our atlas skills to locate the geographical locations of various famous train journeys and compared the geographical features and climates of these areas.

In Maths, our focus has moved onto fractions and decimals, beginning with tenths and moving on to how to add and subtract fractions.

Our current genre in English is non-chronological reports, and we have studied all sorts of information texts from the library to find out the features of a non-chronological report and applied this to our model text, "Rome".

YEAR 5 MESSAGES

On the way to answer our Big Idea guiding question 'Can we make our own rainforest?' this week we have looked at life cycles of different animals who live in the rainforest and started to research how different animals have adapted in order to survive in the rainforest. In Writing, we have identified features of a non-chronological report and also created our very own animal that we have discovered in the rainforest and will be writing our non-chronological report about! In Maths, we have learned how to multiply fractions and find fractions of amount using Terry T and next week will use Terry T to find whole numbers. We have also continued hockey in PE! Our spelling focus for next week will be 5 words which do not follow a spelling rule and our times table focus is our 12 times table.

Thank you to all the children who have brought in jars to create their rainforest. Please could your child bring a jar in (named) if they have not already brought one in before Friday 7th.




