World Book Day will be celebrated nationwide on Thursday 6th March. To celebrate World Book Day, in school, each class has been given their very own copy of the book 'Journey' by Aaron Becker.

The book is about a lonely girl who draws a magic door on her bedroom wall and through it escapes into a world where wonder, adventure and danger abound. Red marker in hand, she creates different modes of transport: a boat, a hot air balloon and a flying carpet. Each mode of transport carrying her on a spectacularly journey towards an uncertain destiny. - How do we know explorers have been to place they've discovered?

Optional homelearning activities-

Week 1: Research an explorer of your choice then create an information fact file about them. This could be a presented as a leaflet, poster or a powerpoint/Google slides presentation.

Week 2: Write an adventure story about an explorer. This could involve the explorer you researched last week or another explorer of your choice!

Week 3: Make your very own treasure hunt and map.

Once you've finished, ask a friend or family member to complete it by reading the map to find the treasure!

Week 4: Go on an exploration of your own! Record your exploration through drawings, writing or photographs.
