Starting out as a night shelter, Centrepoint's work with young people has evolved beyond all recognition over the last 50 years.

In the centre of London's Soho in December 1969, the Revered Ken Leech opened a night shelter in the basement of his church to give homeless, young people a safe place to sleep. Our services are what make Centrepoint so special, we focus on giving young people not just a bed for a night but a home where they can reclaim their future with the support of our dedicated frontline workers.

Over the years we have grown, offering services around the country and developing truly innovative approaches to help young people. We work in partnership with other charities all over the UK, we learn from each other and we join forces to call for change. We know we can't end youth homelessness alone – it will take collaboration and systemic change but we believe we can do it and are committed to ending youth homelessness.

We started with one small shelter, now we support more than 2,000 young people every day through our floating support, rough sleeping and resettlement services but with almost 136,000 young people at risk of or experiencing homelessness last year – we're needed more than ever.



Knavesmire's Easter Eco Challenge

What does it involve?

Over the Easter break, we are encouraging children and families to take on an eco challenge and commit to doing something new that will help look after our planet.

To complete the challenge, set yourself one or more pledges to keep up over the Easter holiday.

On Tuesday 22nd April, otherwise known as Earth Day, we will return to school after the Easter break. Upon returning to school, share the pledge/s you've taken by bringing in photos or drawings of what you've been up to and explain what

What happens if I complete the challenge?

If you complete the challenge, maintaining one or more pledges for the entire Easter break, you will have the chance to apply for a Blue Peter Green badge, which gives you free entry to 200+ attractions in the UK.

To earn a Green badge you must:

- Be between 5 15 years old.
- · Apply for your Green badge online (please see link above).
- Ask your parent or guardian for permission to apply.
- Get your parent or guardian to help you fill out your form and personal details.
- · Tell Blue Peter what you do to protect the environment and why being green is important to you.
- · Include a photo or video of yourself taking part in a green activity or create some artwork inspired by the environment, conservation or nature.



Pledge 1: Power

Think about the ways you can reduce your use of oil, gas and electricity. This reduces the amount of harmful greenhouse gases which are largely responsible for the climate crisis.

Ideas include -

- · turning off lights and sockets in the house when not using them
- · walking, cycling or using public transport rather than driving a
- · writing to or sending a picture to your MP about no new oil or gas and investing in renewable energy

Pledge 2: Plastic

This is about ways of reducing your use of plastic. This is important because plastic waste is harmful to our own health and wildlife.

Ideas include -

- · litter picking
- · turning something from your recycling box into something you can use or a piece or art
- · using something refillable rather than a single use piece of plastic
- · making a poster about recycling to display in your window

Pledge 3: Plants

We need more pollinator plants that are good for insects, and we need to create environments where nature can thrive. Replacing meat with plant based foods is also really impactful as farming animals for meat accounts for 15% of harmful gases, which is more than cars, trains and airplanes combined!

Ideas include -

- · building a bug hotel in your garden or outside space
- planting some insect-friendly flowers
- swapping out a 1 meal a week to be purely plant-based







FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND THE KNAVESMIRE OFFER

If your family qualifies for free school meals (aside from the universal free school meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) you will also qualify for The Knavesmire offer. This means, in addition to free school meals, families can be provided with:



- a school jumper <u>or</u> a school cardigan
- a school footwear voucher
- School milk
- one term free swimming travel costs
- two half-terms of free extra-curricular club participation
- free school trips
- negotiated costs for residential visits

Please come to the school office for a form so we can order your child's jumper/cardigan, shoe voucher and milk.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

Free School Meals are automatically applied to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This entitlement can be extended to children where families are in receipt of certain benefits and earnings do not exceed a threshold. These benefits include:

Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit)

North Yorkshire County Council have launched an online portal for free school meal applications that will give you an instant decision on whether your application is successful:

GOVERNOR NEWSLETTER EASTER 2025

This time it's my turn, I'm Thom Jones. I have been a teacher and school head and now run an international programme every summer in Cambridge and spend the rest of the year delivering training (education and corporate) and speaking at conferences. Obviously, I was very excited to become a governor during this last year, having been so impressed by my kids (Reception and Year 4) and all the amazing staff that make KPS somewhere really special.

This last half term, Governors gathered early in the day - our first full governors meeting held during the school day (meaning we could see the school in action spending time with children and staff). We attended the school staff briefing (wishing one teacher a happy birthday at the same time!) and then Mr Gardiner took us through the new Behaviour Curriculum pathway helping us see why this is needed and how it works. You might also have seen this in the last few newsletters. We had a tour of the school, each governor taken around one on one by a pupil from Year 6. We saw the school in action and were all impressed by the calm, content atmosphere and the erudite young adults who showed off their school so proudly and with such knowledge. A full agenda was then covered in the meeting following this tour. This included an update on the School Development Plan, Barcelona trip feedback, the school's Personal Development offer and we reviewed the revised Education Visits policy.

We also looked at the outcomes of our recent governor skills audit. This is a piece of work led by our vice chair. All governors take a lead on one to more aspects of the school and this was a chance to match our skills and expertise and see where further training might be needed. We are also considering setting up deputies within these roles to further support and assist, ensuring that we always have plenty of capacity and support new governors as they join the Board.

I hope that gives you a flavour of what we have been up to.

We all wanted to pass on a huge vote of thanks to all the staff who graft, in the face of government cuts and the huge task of making a school like ours work, with incredible energy and enthusiasm. Lastly, we're sure everyone will join us in extending grateful congratulations to the Friends of KPS for their work in getting ready for Easter and the fundraising etc that has all involved.

We have set the children a homework project for over the Easter holidays. We would like them to research their chosen topic for their non-chronological report ready for them to write after the Easter break.


