FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND THE KNAVESMIRE OFFER

If your family qualifies for free school meals (aside from the universal free school meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) you will also qualify for The Knavesmire offer. This means, in addition to free school meals,

families can be provided with:



- a school jumper or a school cardigan
- a school footwear voucher
- School milk
- one term free swimming travel costs
- two half-terms of free extra-curricular club participation
- free school trips
- negotiated costs for residential visits

If you are not currently in receipt of these benefits, but would like to be, please contact the school office. We will ask you to complete a google form so we can collect relevant information and order your child's jumper/cardigan, shoe voucher and milk.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

Free School Meals are automatically applied to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This entitlement can be extended to children where families are in receipt of certain benefits and earnings do not exceed a threshold. These benefits include:

Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit)

Please note that as of September 2024 we are required to see evidence of any medical appointments. Please send any screenshots to accompany your absence email so that we can log this absence appropriately.


REPORTING ABSENCE & SICKNESS PROCEDURE

COMPUTING UPDATE

Dear Pupils, Parents and Carers,

Over the past 6 years, Key Stage 2 pupils at Knavesmire have been using a website called CS First, which has allowed them to learn programming using the Scratch language and save projects on their own individual dashboard attached to their Google Classroom profile.



Unfortunately, the website is going to be decommissioned and will no longer be available after 30th June 2025 and this is a note to remind the children that their CS First Scratch projects will therefore not be accessible after this time and they will not be able to log into their dashboard at school or home.

I will be saving a wide selection of work as evidence as a matter of course, but some children may have projects that they wish to personally keep and, if so, they would need to download each project to a personal computer and then upload to their own personal Scratch account, if they have one. There is no need for children to save any projects from a school point of view, or to have a personal Scratch account; this is only a message to those children who may want to keep particular projects.

It is important to note, however, that, if children do choose to save any projects they have made at school, to a personal Scratch account, they DO NOT SHARE any of their projects to the wider online Scratch community and this could be part of ongoing conversations you have with your child about online safety.

We are waiting to find out what CS First will be replaced with and I will, of course, let the children know as soon as possible.

In Nursery this week we have begun our new Big Idea which is 'Under the Sea'. We will be learning about the creatures that live in the sea as well as the importance of recycling and the impact on our oceans. RECEPTION MESSAGES

Reception has had a brilliant week starting their new Big Idea 'Sailing the Seven Seas' we have learnt how to speak like a pirate, we have found out our pirate names and we have learnt all about pirates! In Maths we have started to learn all about sharing then we will be moving onto grouping in the following weeks. In Phonics we are learning how to read words with adjacent consonants and digraphs. We have a new junk modelling area, if you have any paper/food boxes, yogurt pots etc we would appreciate them though there is a good chance they will be coming home again in a different form! We are holding an end of year performance in Rowntree Park on Monday 14th July at 1:45. The children will be singing a selection of songs from our Big Ideas and will last around 20 minutes. We need volunteers to walk down to the park and back to school with us, please let us know if you would be free to do this.

YEAR 1 MESSAGES

Welcome back to the final half term of Year One! This week, we have started our new Big Idea and our end goal is to design and explore an imaginary island. We have already found out about the four countries of the United kingdom, trying to identify where they are and what they are like. We also learnt the names of the capital city for each country.

In English we have written character reports about Goldilocks and next week we are planning and writing reports about a character that might live on our island.

In Maths we described position and direction using language such as behind, under, above, left and right.

Next week, the children will complete their statutory Phonic Screening check. We have had lots of practise, so the children are well prepared.

YEAR 2 MESSAGES

We have welcomed Year 2 back to school with a fantastic week of learning. We launched our brand new Big Idea based on Robots with the Guiding Purpose to design and programme a robot. The children loved building their computing skills with our Big Idea lessons at the end of the week. We continued to explore Robots through our Writing and Reading with the children answering retrieval and inference questions alongside looking at narrative writing. In Maths, we have been recognising statistics in the form of block diagrams and pictograms - the children even collected their own data to then present in graphs. Our new PE topic is Athletics! The children will look at jumping, running and throwing to build these Athletics skills. Please ensure the children are bringing appropriate clothing and a change of PE shoes into school for these lessons. Thank you for your efforts with reading at home and practising commonly misspelt words. This will continue to be a focus for the remainder of the term alongside consolidating our 2s, 5s and 10 times tables.

Year 3 have had a fantastic first week back! In Maths, the children have been introduced to money, have converted pounds to pence and have learned how to add and subtract money. In Writing, the children made predictions about the front cover of a book before finding out that it's Stone Age Boy by Satoshi Kitamura. They produced a shared write, alongside their learning partner, used drama to reenact scenes from the book and learned how to create expanded noun phrases. This half-term, the children will be learning about The Stone Age to The Iron Age, with their Guiding Purpose being to create a Stone Age settlement. In PE, the children were introduced to rounders and this will be our unit moving forward this half term. On Thursday, children from 3S took part in their first Forest School session of the year. They learned how to light a fire safely and looked at how Stone Age people utilised a fire for many different purposes. These forest school sessions will run for the entirety of the half-term, alternating between classes.

- Spelling Recap on Re and Mis prefixes (worksheet to include drawing and spelling.)

YEAR 4 MESSAGES

In Year 4, we have had a busy week, as the first lot of multiplication checks have been underway. A huge thanks to the adults at home who are continuing to help their children to practice their times tables, as the children have approached the check with confidence and 100% effort. Please continue to practice with your children at home, as more checks will be completed next week.

In English, we have continued our learning about poetry, focussing on "Owl", by Pie Corbett, and writing a shared poem called, "Cave".

Our Big Idea focus has changed to the question, "Is there really no place like home?" where we will answer questions around fantastical worlds and use plenty of imagination. To answer the question, "What is fantastical about our world?", we began by studying the water cycle, drawing diagrams of the water cycle set in fantastical lands and creating a working model of it. We then put on our explorer hats and identified the biomes of our fantastical world.

Multiplication checks continue next week. Please continue to practice times tables with your child at home so that they can approach their check with confidence.

On 27th June, Year 4 will be taking a trip to Rowntree Park, to continue to explore our fantastical world. A separate letter will be sent with details of this.

A great first week back! On Monday and Wednesday, we had a visitor from the York Theatre Royal to assist us with the preparations for the Playhouse Project.

In maths, we reminded ourselves how to multiply and divide by 10, 100 and 1000 and then focused on how to translate 2D shapes. Next week, we will turn our attention to converting measures.

During our writing sessions, we have looked at how to write explanation texts which will lead up to us writing an explanation of how to survive in the world of the Creakers - The Woleb.

During our Big Idea lessons, we have rehearsed some key scenes and started to design and create some props for the final performance. You should receive a note about your child's costume at the beginning of next week.

There will be maths and spelling homework this week. Maths homework is based on multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000 (MyMaths). Spelling homework is to practise 10 words from the Year 5 and 6 spelling list (sheet inside homework books).

In Big Idea, we have started to answer our guiding question 'how can we look after our coasts?' This week, we have explored different coasts around the UK and Italy.


