WHOLE SCHOOL INFORMATION



FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND THE KNAVESMIRE OFFER

If your family qualifies for free school meals (aside from the universal free school meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) you will also qualify for The Knavesmire offer. This means, in addition to free school meals,

families can be provided with:



- a school jumper or a school cardigan
- a school footwear voucher
- School milk
- one term free swimming travel costs
- two half-terms of free extra-curricular club participation
- free school trips
- negotiated costs for residential visits

If you are not currently in receipt of these benefits, but would like to be, please contact the school office. We will ask you to complete a google form so we can collect relevant information and order your child's jumper/cardigan, shoe voucher and milk.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

Free School Meals are automatically applied to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This entitlement can be extended to children where families are in receipt of certain benefits and earnings do not exceed a threshold. These benefits include:

Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit)

North Yorkshire County Council have launched an online portal for free school meal applications that will give you an instant decision on whether your application is successful:

COMPUTING UPDATE

Dear Pupils, Parents and Carers,

Over the past 6 years, Key Stage 2 pupils at Knavesmire have been using a website called CS First, which has allowed them to learn programming using the Scratch language and save projects on their own individual dashboard attached to their Google Classroom profile.



Unfortunately, the website is going to be decommissioned and will no longer be available after 30th June 2025 and this is a note to remind the children that their CS First Scratch projects will therefore not be accessible after this time and they will not be able to log into their dashboard at school or home.

I will be saving a wide selection of work as evidence as a matter of course, but some children may have projects that they wish to personally keep and, if so, they would need to download each project to a personal computer and then upload to their own personal Scratch account, if they have one. There is no need for children to save any projects from a school point of view, or to have a personal Scratch account; this is only a message to those children who may want to keep particular projects.

It is important to note, however, that, if children do choose to save any projects they have made at school, to a personal Scratch account, they DO NOT SHARE any of their projects to the wider online Scratch community and this could be part of ongoing conversations you have with your child about online safety.

We are waiting to find out what CS First will be replaced with and I will, of course, let the children know as soon as possible.

YEAR 1 MESSAGES

It has been a great week in Year One and everyone has worked hard despite how hot they have been feeling! On Tuesday, we joined Year Six in the playground for some games they had planned for Year One. It was really good fun and all the children loved the games that had been organised.

In Big Idea, we compared a village in the UK with a village in Australia and the children found a number of similarities. We also identified different features in Rowntree Park and identified how it was different in the past. In English, we wrote sentences about the things we have enjoyed in Year One and we will use some of these sentences in the end of year report self assessments. In Maths, we have worked with numbers between 50 and 100 and using the symbols > < and = when comparing them.

We are asking again for your support in ensuring ALL toys and collectable cards stay at home. Children have become very distressed when things have gone missing from drawers and lockers or they have been damaged in some way. They are also causing many distractions during lesson time which is therefore disrupting learning. Thank you for your support in this matter and we hope you have a lovely, sunny weekend.

YEAR 2 MESSAGES

The children have done a great job at trying to keep cool in the heat this week! In English, the children have been busy creating their own stories. Last week, they planned their characters and settings, and this week they began writing their stories. We're excited to see their creativity come to life and look forward to sharing their work in future lessons. In Maths, the children have been practising their times tables and arithmetic skills, as well as working hard on their maths quizzes. In Big Idea, the focus has been on computing. The children created 'unplugged' sequences for their partners to follow, then worked together to 'debug' them to ensure they ran smoothly. We also had our first look at Scratch, and next week, the children will begin creating their own Scratch projects! Enjoy the sunshine!

YEAR 3 MESSAGES

This week, Year 3 have worked incredibly hard whilst completing a range of assessments: Maths, Sentence Types and a Spelling Quiz. In PE, the children have become increasingly confident in rounders and their fielding and batting skills. In Big Idea, we have learnt all about the water cycle and states of matter. We have also created jellyfish collages which you can see in our windows!


