FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND THE KNAVESMIRE OFFER

If your family gualifies for free school meals (aside from the universal free school meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) you will also gualify for The Knavesmire offer. This means, in addition to free school meals, families can be provided with:



- a school jumper or a school cardigan
- a school footwear voucher
- School milk
- one term free swimming travel costs
- two half-terms of free extra-curricular club participation
- free school trips
- negotiated costs for residential visits

If you are not currently in receipt of these benefits, but would like to be, please contact the school office. We will ask you to complete a google form so we can collect relevant information and order child's your jumper/cardigan, shoe voucher and milk.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

Free School Meals are automatically applied to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This entitlement can be extended to children where families are in receipt of certain benefits and earnings do not exceed a threshold. These benefits include:

Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit)

North Yorkshire County Council have launched an online portal for free school meal applications that will give you an instant decision on whether your application is successful: https://www.northyorks.gov.uk/free-school-meals

Lost Property

Just a quick reminder to remember to name all items that your child brings into school. Any mislaid named items will be returned to children in class.

We have a large number of unnamed items of uniform/coats/snack boxes/water bottles etc. These have all been placed in the gazebo in the playground. Feel free to look through these to look for any misplaced items. If there are any unclaimed items at the end of the school year, they will be donated or recycled.

We do not run a lost property in school. Any unnamed items will continue to be placed in the gazebo. The gazebo will be emptied of unclaimed items at the end of each half term.

YEAR 2 MESSAGES

Year 2 have had a brilliant week rounding off our learning ahead of the summer break. In Maths, we've been busy revisiting key concepts with time and calculating fraction of amounts. The children also completed a times tables assessment to consolidate their learning. In English, we've been focusing on spelling and grammar. The children have been learning how to use apostrophes correctly, spelling words with suffixes and writing sentences using common exception words. They've shown lots of care in their writing and are becoming much more accurate. The children have been working brilliantly as a team during our Rounders lessons, applying their throwing, catching and fielding skills in a match setting. In our Big Idea lessons, we've started developing our word processing skills which we know will be an ongoing practice!

We will be sending home the children's log in details for them to access Numbergym over the summer holidays if they wish. There is no pressure to do so however we know there are some children in the cohort who are eager to do this, with older siblings at home. We will help the children to log in at school next week so they will be familiar with the website.

We enjoyed another lovely transition session on Wednesday - the children were really excited to see their new learning environments for next year! It was Miss Walls' last day on Friday with 2G - we really appreciate all of her hard work in supporting the children's learning and we wish her the best for her future.

We have not sent the children home with a new levelled reading book this week as we are hopeful that we can spend the next week chasing up the missing books ahead of the summer break. Please can we encourage you to have a final look for any school books that need to be returned? Next week we will be sending the children home with books, bags and belongings! We will try our best to spread this out over the week however please can we ask for every child to bring a plastic bag into school on Tuesday, in preparation for this!

YEAR 3 MESSAGES

Year 3 have had another fun-filled week! In Writing, they've looked at the rules for direct speech and have begun to think about the opening dialogue for their narrative. In Maths, the children have started to look at the Year 4 calculation for addition. In Big Idea, the children looked at human and physical geographical features and compared Knaresborough to Bebra in Germany. In PE, the children enjoyed running their final Golden Mile of Year 3 on Wednesday and their penultimate swimming lesson on Thursday morning. 3U enjoyed Forest School this week, where they learned how to use a compass and studied different maps. Next week, both classes will enjoy their final Forest School session together in Rowntree Park.

There will be no set homework this week but if the children would like to continue their learning at home, please feel free to revise times tables on Numbergym/TT Rockstars. Spelling shed is available for spelling revision too.




