## FREE SCHOOL MEALS AND THE KNAVESMIRE OFFER

If your family gualifies for free school meals (aside from the universal free school meals for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) you will also gualify for The Knavesmire offer. This means, in addition to free school meals, families can be provided with:



- a school jumper or a school cardigan
- a school footwear voucher
- School milk
- one term free swimming travel costs
- two half-terms of free extra-curricular club participation
- free school trips
- negotiated costs for residential visits

If you are not currently in receipt of these benefits, but would like to be, please contact the school office. We will ask you to complete a google form so we can collect relevant information and order child's your jumper/cardigan, shoe voucher and milk.

## FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

Free School Meals are automatically applied to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. This entitlement can be extended to children where families are in receipt of certain benefits and earnings do not exceed a threshold. These benefits include:

Universal Credit, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit (but not Working Tax Credit)

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## **COMPUTING UPDATE**

Dear Pupils, Parents and Carers,

Over the past 6 years, Key Stage 2 pupils at Knavesmire have been using a website called CS First, which has allowed them to learn programming using the Scratch language and save projects on their own individual dashboard attached to their Google Classroom profile.

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Unfortunately, the website is going to be decommissioned and will no longer be available after 30th June 2025 and this is a note to remind the children that their CS First Scratch projects will therefore not be accessible after this time and they will not be able to log into their dashboard at school or home.

I will be saving a wide selection of work as evidence as a matter of course, but some children may have projects that they wish to personally keep and, if so, they would need to download each project to a personal computer and then upload to their own personal Scratch account, if they have one. *There is <u>no need</u> for children to save any projects from a school point of view, or to have a personal Scratch account; this is only a message to those children who may <u>want</u> to keep particular projects.* 

It is important to note, however, that, if children do choose to save any projects they have made at school, to a personal Scratch account, they DO NOT SHARE any of their projects to the wider online Scratch community and this could be part of ongoing conversations you have with your child about online safety.

We are waiting to find out what CS First will be replaced with and I will, of course, let the children know as soon as possible.

## **YEAR 1 MESSAGES**

Year One have worked hard this week learning about Amelia Earhart and her solo journey across the Atlantic Ocean. They have also made a map of their imaginary island, including different physical and human features. In English, the children write recounts about a hot day at school and in Maths they have been learning to recognise and know the value of coins and notes. Please remember the request to keep all toys and collectable cards at home; they are still causing upset and distraction in the classroom.

## **YEAR 2 MESSAGES**

Year 2 have had another fantastic week full of fun, teamwork and brilliant learning! In English, we've been exploring how to explain a process clearly. We started by identifying the features of explanation texts and generating our own questions. The children worked together in groups to practise using conjunctions and develop their ideas—there was lots of great discussion and collaboration. In Maths, we have been recapping some topics including shape and measurement. We continue to build our times tables knowledge and arithmetic skills. Our Big Idea lessons have been particularly exciting this week as we started learning how to use programming software. The children even used a Minecraft-style program to learn how to sequence instructions. In PE, we've now moved onto Rounders with throwing and fielding skills. During our class assembly times, we have been concentrating on friendships and playground kindness. We have asked the children to consider how they are including others and using empathy to think about other people's feelings. We would love to hear that these conversations are also being supported at home. Next Wednesday, we are looking forward to our first transition session for the children to meet their new teacher for September and to see their learning environments. We will be helping the children in school with any transition worries but please keep in touch if you have any additional concerns for their feelings and questions!

## **YEAR 3 MESSAGES**

Year 3 have had a wonderful week and have all worked incredibly hard! This week, the children have completed assessments in Reading, Writing and Maths. In Big Idea, the children made their own Stone Age shelters based on their design of a shelter from one of the Stone Age eras: Paleolithic, Mesolithic and Neolithic. On Thursday afternoon, 3U enjoyed their second Forest School session where they made bread; 3S enjoyed their second Forest School session last week. In PE, the children enjoyed an afternoon of rounders on Wednesday afternoon and their swimming lessons on Thursday morning.

### This week's homework:

Maths - Six pieces of maths homework on MyMaths that are recapping some of the elements we have covered this year. There will be no spelling homework this week because of the amount of words that we asked the children to revise last week. There will be time allocated in class next week to complete some of the maths homework, so don't feel obliged to do this all at home.

### **YEAR 4 MESSAGES**

This week, Year 4 have done a brilliant job completing their final assessments. We are very proud of the hard work and energy they have put into the last four weeks.

In Maths, we have had an arithmetic focus, brushing up on our multiplication, addition, subtraction and division skills. During English, we are beginning to look at explanation texts such as how-to guides, focussing on the Teacher Pleaser machine. We have spent time getting to know the text and finding out about its features, ready for starting to experiment with writing some guides ourselves next week.


We have had a lovely week in the School House.
